CHARM

What a blessing it has been to serve the Townsend community this past year. Our volunteers have embraced the task the Lord has set be for us.

With campground summer mission teams ending the first of August we have been busy with events in Townsend.

The Tennessee FaithRiders came in September and like always we hosted them in the Charm building for their meals Thursday. Friday and Saturday. They are an evangelistic group of men and women who love the Lord and make a point of sharing wherever they go.

The Heritage Festival was held the last of September and we helped Blount Partnership with that event. The children's area is sponsored by Charm Ministries and we also serve the vendors with water, coffee, hot chocolate and snacks through the day. We were blessed to have two teams come in from Georgia and Florida to help set up and serve with us for the festival.

The monthly food giveaways continue and we are seeing our numbers rise. We are still praying with each person that comes through the line. We also have heard from some of the people that prayers were answered. Glory to God as this helps us with building relationships with those in need.

The Motel Ministry has ceased for the winter but contacts are still being made with them. Charm is blessed to have Kathy, Kim and Darlene who are faithful servants that give of their Sunday mornings to go and minister with those women and men who have to work on Sundays. They have needs, they have problems, they have hard jobs but they know they are loved by these ladies and our volunteers stay in touch with them throughout the winter months.

November and December has been a whirlwind for ministry in Charm. We started receiving backpacks from churches in November. The ladies mission group from Madison Avenue helped go thru the backpacks with our group to make sure each child receives bibles and a nice backpack. The Southern Baptist backpack Ministry supplied backpacks for Townsend Elementary which were distributed December 12th. Springview Baptist Church sewing group made stockings for each student to be given out the day we gave the backpacks out. As Linda Ledford said often "give them a little Jesus". Well that stocking gave them Jesus with items pertaining to the real meaning of Christmas. Steve Monroe gave a HisStory social study lesson with each class at the school sharing the birth of Christ. He asked many of the classes what Christmas meant and did they know Jesus. We were excited to hear that the majority of students knew the answer. We had churches in Georgia to partner with Charm and brought 215 more backpacks to give out. These went to Rockford, Porter, Heritage Middle and Heritage High School. Partnerships with churches is essential to the ministry at Charm so we can be the church and go share with others. Each of the these backpacks had a bible in them. In Blount county thru these backpacks what a wonderful way to share Christ to students who may not know of our Lord.

December 9th we gave out the regular food giveaway of 67 boxes of food and gave out 10 boxes that were prepared by the Baptist Center. It was a rainy, soggy day and we were short of volunteers BUT GOD who knows our needs sent a small church in Wears Valley to help. Just what we needed that day. Only God knows the needs before we do. We are thankful for his hand upon the ministry we all serve in.

December 16th Charm hosted a toy giveaway at the Charm building. The children that receives the gifts go to Townsend and Wearwoood Elementary in Wears Valley. Parents come and pickup toys for their children. They are wrapped so when they take them home the children do not see them. Seventy two children will now have Christmas that their parents picked out for them. We had 9 ladies and 1 man wrapping. We had a group of ladies from Madison Avenue who came and helped wrap. The KOA donated Charm some very nice tennis shoes to give out and the parents were able to try on and take a pair of shoes. We had clothes for children that were handed out also. The parents were given apples and oranges to take with them. The Charm Backcountry building was a buzz. I call it controlled chaos. As one of our ladies says quite often "Ministry can be messy" well it was in a blessed way. I need to share that a family that lives in Townsend supplies the toys (which are very nice) that are given out. They also support a Honduran church in Wears Valley and gave out toys to 160 children Friday night before the giveaway on the 16th. This has been laid on this family's heart to help provide a little extra for children and partnering with Charm has achieved that. They do not want recognition, they just want to serve the Lord with which they have been given.

You can see we have been busy but we still have needs. One of our chaplains has moved back to Indiana and we will be needing a chaplain for Sunday morning services at one of the small campgrounds beginning Memorial Day weekend. If you are a servant of the Lord and feel this is something you would like to do pease contact Steve Monroe at 865-385-4968. He can answer any questions you might have. Another prayer request is we could use another lady to help Kathy in the motel ministry on Sunday's. Kim and Darlene go as a team and Kathy could use another lady to go with her. Please pray about this and if you feel led reach out to Charm and we can talk with you about it.

I know this is long but for us it is a blessing to share. If you would like for any of our volunteers to come and talk with your church or a group in your church we would love to.

If you prayed for Charm, If you or your church donated to Charm we are grateful. We realize without people giving that we could not reach as many people as we do. May God bless you in the New Year and may we all look to serve HIM in all that we do.
