today for more information, including dates, costs and details of each ministry. I grew up in a local Baptist church. I was exposed to missions regularly. I knew as a teen that I was called to serve on the mission field. However, as I made plans to "go", I got scared and backed out. I told God He would have to give me a different task; I couldn't do what He was asking me to do. My faith and trust did not extend beyond my own thinking.

Twenty-one years later, in 2010, I was invited to go to West Africa as part of a mission team. After prayerful consideration and God paving the way for me, I committed to go. I expected to be shocked by what I would see and learn on this journey, but I did not expect to be so deeply impacted and burdened for the Muslim people, particularly women, that I would meet. God placed another call on my life to develop personal relation-ships with these women and to share the gospel with them for five years. I am still passionate about sharing the gospel with the Muslim people, but safety issued have prevented us from being able to return there since 2020.

When God places a call on our hearts, He provides a way. I recently learned that Toronto is a massive hub for immigrants from many nations. Not only are there more than half a million Muslims in the greater Toronto area, there are Jews, Sikhs, Chinese, Hindus and Buddhists in large concentrations. God is bringing the world to our front door!

So, the question is, have you been called to share the gospel with the lost? The short answer is "Yes". The Great Commission commands us to go into all the world and share the good news of Jesus. There are MANY opportunities to serve both locally and abroad. Will you go?

#### HIGHLIGHTS FROM AVILA & MADRID,

#### SPAIN-MAY 2024

God organized a team of 10 people from two area churches, along with three translators that we did not know and created a beautiful ministry family. We began each day with prayer and a devotion in the hotel lobby each morning. This was such an encouraging time of connection and focus on our purpose. During our time of daily street evangelism, there was a precious, bold, Christian couple from the church that prayed constantly for us and for hearts to be opened. God answered our prayers and brought TWO new believers into the fellowship of the church. Praise the Lord for His faithfulness!

We also had a great time of fellowship and studying the Word with the children and adults during our nightly VBS. Sean and Jim shared a deep Biblical study on what it means to have a Godly marriage.

We look forward to seeing God at work through our continued partnership with this church.

We are extremely blessed to have been able to share the Word of God with 272 souls throughout April and May. Out of the 272 souls, 137 made the decision to have a brief bible study while they waited for their food orders to be filled. The total number of souls the gospel has been shared with throughout this year is 538; there were an additional 141 souls reached during the Resurrection Tote Distribution. This ministry is so thrilled to have had a total of 336 souls (out of 538) that have agreed to have the Word of God shared with them while they waited for their food orders to be filled. We need prayer for two souls that have confessed Jesus is Lord and desire to be baptized—it is unfortunate that we have been unable to contact these two ladies. Please keep them in your prayers in the hopes that they yield to the Holy Spirit. The Baptist Center has added 66 new families that total 198 people in the households for the months of April and May. We have added 166 new families or 529 individuals for the total number in households for the year. In order to feed all of these families, we spent \$3,345.39 in April and \$3,861.11 in May. We have managed to lower our cost to feed by \$300-\$400 by designating our canned meats for the individuals with restricted cooking facilities (the homeless/those living in hotels). To make up for the canned meat, we have added an additional package of frozen/raw meat to the client's food order form from rescue food (zero cost) that is donated from local grocery stores. This is only a temporary solution, but we are doing everything we can to maximize every dollar that is entrusted in our care. Each month the cost to feed is rising, our client load is increasing every day, and donations are low. Please keep the donations and support coming. This is a great ministry that has a great need; due to the cost of living soaring. There is a large portion of Blount County that is physically afflicted and is in desperate need of help. As these events (end-time hardships) unfold and more people seek assistance it gives the ministry more opportunity to expose spiritual affliction upon souls that are destitute of the divine life giving power of God; a good majority of the clients that have decided to join the bible study, have admitted this.

Thanks to everybody who donated towards the Beat the Heat Fan Drive. This awesome association has stepped up and donated over 180 fans & we will be able to share the Word of God to each of them. Due to the fact that we are not budgeted for toiletries and cleaning items. We are asking our churches to help us with that need. Instead of supplying food for the month you are scheduled, we are asking you to provide toiletries & cleaning supplies. Food donations are welcome but monetary donations will better serve the efficiency of the ministry for food because we can purchase food from Second Harvest significantly cheaper. The Baptist Center is in need of ongoing donations toward toiletries and cleaning supplies. This is not part of our budget and we rely solely on donations to supply these items to our clients, so please keep them coming. We are seeking volunteers such as young adults, college students, H.S. students, mature teenagers, stay at home parents, or anyone who is available to volunteer. # **CAMP TIPTON**

Camp Season is currently in full swing. We've had a busy summer and have quite a busy summer planned as well. We are having four nights of overnight camp again as well as two summer mission teams. Mission teams are going to focus on building a ramp/staircase up to the cabins to make it safer to walk up to them. They are also planning on expanding our playground at the pavilion and adding a small ropes course as well as some newer wooden playground equipment.



We are currently working to finish plans with an architect for the new bunkhouse. The plan is to have four downstairs rooms, two upstairs rooms, and a common meeting area with a small warming kitchen. Each room will have restrooms inside. This should allow us to house a group of around 30-40 people in the same cabin for retreats. Please pray that getting the plans approved by the county will go smoothly. After approved, I will share the plans with everyone in the annual meeting later in the year.

We are down slightly this year in overall registration for summer camp; however, we are still having a great turnout and the Lord is at work. Currently we are averaging 56 campers per week, and, by the end of summer I am hoping that number will increase to 60-65 campers per week. We are currently at five children accepting Christ or rededication their life to Christ as well. For photos of summer, we post weekly on Instagram and Facebook. Search Camp Tipton in the search bar and you should be able to find our profiles.

Continue to pray for the spiritual maturity and Christian mentorship of my staff members as well. I've had 20 counselors this year working in various positions ranging from maintenance, Counselor in training, Junior Counselor, Senior Counselor, and Day Camp and Middle School Camp Directors. While we try not to turn children away for lack of funds, we are still needing donations to go towards campers on scholarships. 
